<sup>7</sup>Now Herod the tetrarch heard about all that was going on. And he was perplexed because some were saying that John had been raised from the dead, <sup>8</sup>others that Elijah had appeared, and still others that one of the prophets of long ago had come back to life. <sup>9</sup>But Herod said, "I beheaded John. Then he took them with him and they withdrew by themselves to a town called Bethsaida, <sup>11</sup>but the crowds learned about it and followed him. #### **Give The Gift of Life**

Dear Friends.

I would like to introduce you to Ty Echebarria. Some of you may already know Ty. He is an incredible 28-year-old young man from our community who is in need of a living kidney donor.



I have only met Ty within the last couple months, and I have been blown away by him. He has one of the biggest hearts I think I've ever seen with a huge passion for Jesus. Ty and his brother were both born with a disease called *progressive tubulo-interstitial nephropathy* and cholestatic *liver disease*, leaving both boys with the need for liver and kidney transplants at very young ages. Ty's mother and father (Dawn and Glenn Stuart) have both already witnessed the blessings of what God can do by being living donors themselves for their children. Ty received a kidney from his father when he was just 10, which has lasted him 18 years! Unfortunately, this kidney is now starting to fail. Ty's most recent GFR level puts him in stage 4 kidney failure. There are only 5 stages of kidney failure, and stage 5 would mean needing to start dialysis and another whole very difficult road to go down. The process of becoming a donor can take time, (from starting testing to surgery can take up to a year) so the sooner one can get started with the process, the better

There have been so many advances with kidney donation programs that now we don't even need to be a blood type match to donate! UW Madison has an absolutely wonderful living donor paired program available where you can now donate to someone within the program (for Ty), and Ty would be able to receive a kidney from someone else within that same program who would be a match for him. If you are interested in becoming a donor or just have questions, please call/text/email Ty or his mom, and they would be more than happy to answer any questions you might have. Thank you for taking the time to read Ty's story. I ask that you pray about it, and consider being a donor for Ty and giving him the gift of life.

#### Introduction to living kidney donation

As a kidney donor, you can greatly improve someone's life. To the recipient, you will always be their hero. More than 80 percent of the people on the national organ transplant wait list need a kidney, and wait times are increasing. Living with kidney disease is very difficult. Dialysis treatments are tiring and do not end the disease. Living kidney donation is the best way to save more lives. Did you know:

- ·You only need one kidney to live a healthy, long life.
- ·Most donor surgery is done laparoscopically, meaning through tiny incisions.
- ·The recuperation period is usually fairly quick, generally two weeks.
- •The cost of your evaluation and surgery will be covered by the recipient's insurance. The hospital can give you extensive information on this.
- ·You will have a separate team of healthcare professionals to evaluate you as a living donor. Their job is to help you understand the risks and benefits and look out for YOUR best interests.

#### Why is a kidney from a living donor better?

A kidney transplant can happen as soon as a donor is found, approved and ready to donate. Getting a kidney from a living donor is better for the recipient because:

- ·The recipient will get transplanted sooner, ending or avoiding dialysis
- ·Living kidney transplant surgeries can be scheduled, making recovery easier
- •The kidney may be a better match to the recipient, and will come from a person who has been tested to ensure they are very healthy
- ·A kidney from a living donor will last much longer than one from a deceased donor, lessoning their need for another kidney in the future

#### Who can be a living kidney donor?

You do not need to be related to recipient. You do not need to have matching blood types. If you are older than age 18 and in good physical and emotional health you can apply to be a living donor. Not everyone who considers donation can or will donate. Our Independent Living Donor Advocate represents you, the donor to make sure your decision remains private. They are responsible for representing your wishes, discussing any issues and being your advocate.
